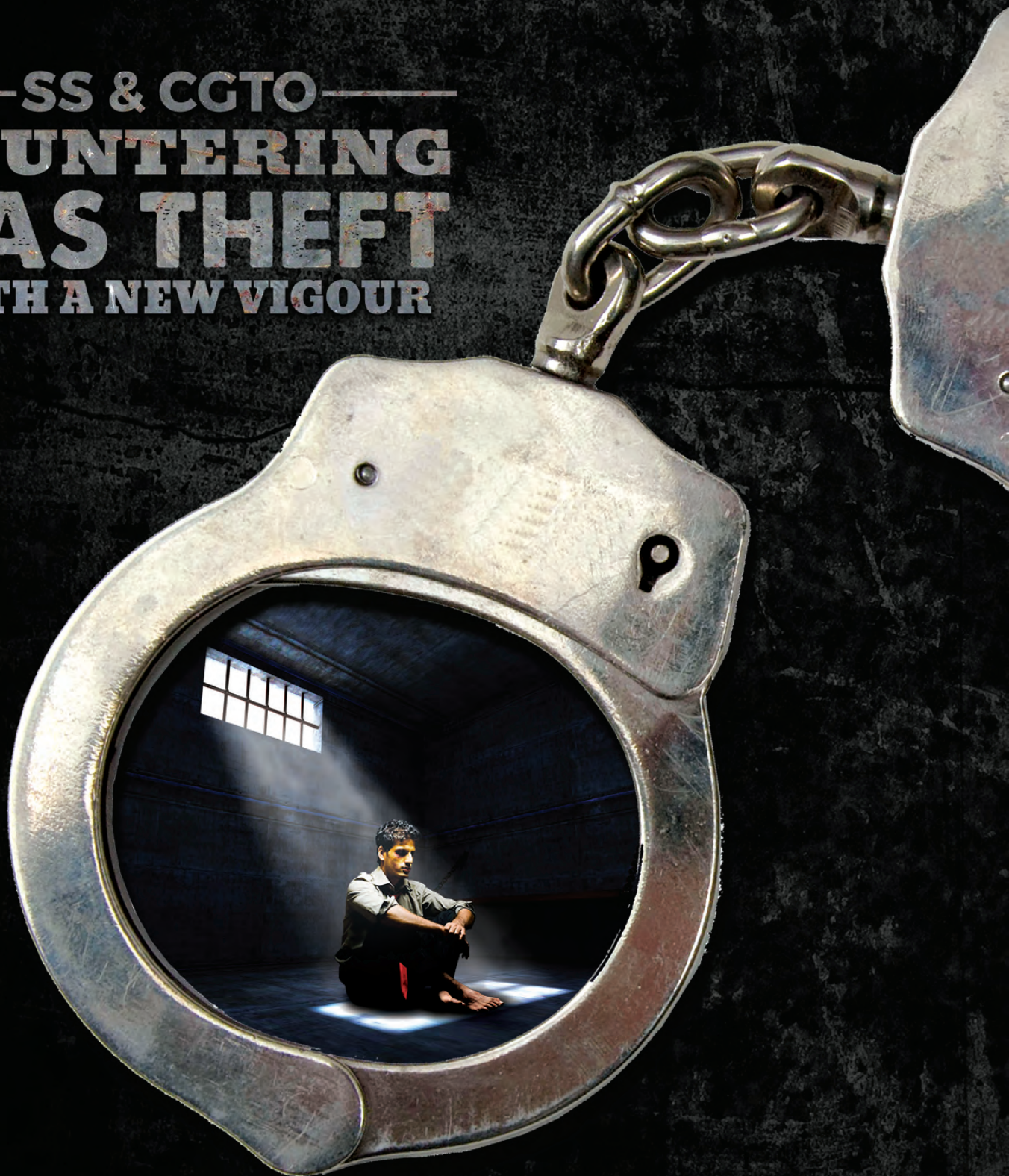

## Silencing the critics

Dear readers,

Not too long ago, the very idea of the import of LNG was brushed aside by the naysayers. However, in July 2017 the journey that began a few years ago with the arrival of 148,517 cubic meters of LNG into Pakistan, reached a landmark with the arrival of 100th cargo carrying this chilled fuel, into the shores of Port Qasim. The import of LNG and development of requisite infrastructure in form of a 42" dia., 342-km gas pipeline from Karachi to Punjab for transporting 600 mmcf/d re-gasified LNG has alleviated the demand-supply gap issues to a great extent. SSGC, being a front line player in the country's LNG Supply Chain, is receiving RLNG through Elengy Terminal Pakistan Ltd. (ETPL), Pakistan's first LNG Terminal. In this respect, SSGC's Liquefied Gases Department is playing a pivotal role in managing the matters of logistics, planning and overall coordination with the stakeholders involved.

The milestone reached in the form of the 100th cargo is clearly deserving of a special coverage in this issue. Also find here a report on the challenging LPG-Air Mix Project which is under construction in Awaran, and coverage of the establishment of a department dedicated towards fighting the menace of gas theft.

# SS and CGTO Department established to counter gas theft



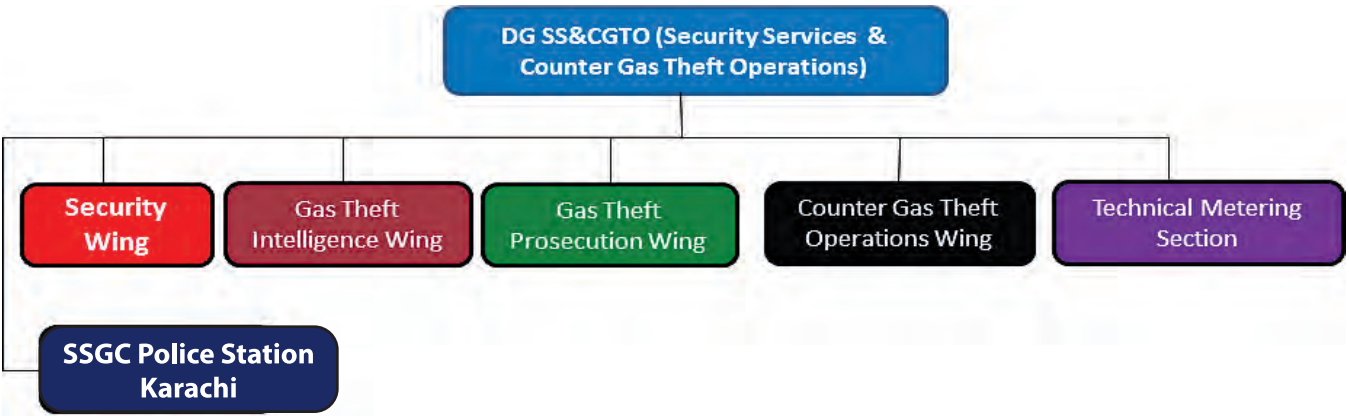
The Security Services and Control Gas Theft Operations Department (SS & CGTO) was established on July 3, 2017 to effectively counter the menace of natural gas theft, one of the primary causes of UFG.

The Department was established primarily to ensure strict enforcement of the Gas (Theft

and Recovery) Act passed in 2016 by the National Assembly of Pakistan.

The SS & CGTO Department has been structured on more result-oriented lines, whereby experienced civilians and law enforcement officials are taking care of its gas theft intelligence, prosecution and

operations wings. The Department is all set to undertake a number of intelligence based operations by conducting raids on those commercial and industrial units that were involved in blatant gas theft. The Company has been given further boost with establishment of gas utility courts in Sindh and Balochistan. 🔴

# LG Department achieves benchmark of 100 LNG cargoes



Pakistan is facing severe shortfall of energy. Production of electricity is also highly dependent on the availability of gas. The share of natural gas in Pakistan's energy mix is approximately 46% which clearly indicates its importance. Indigenous gas sources in Pakistan are depleting exponentially. Injection of LNG in

Pakistan's energy mix was a major breakthrough in 2015 to bridge the energy shortfall.

SSGCL, as a front line player in the country's LNG Supply Chain, is receiving RLNG through Elengy Terminal Pakistan Ltd. (ETPL). By July 2017, 100 LNG Cargoes were

safely off loaded and re-gasified at EETPL LNG Terminal located in Port Qasim, Karachi. More than 6 MPTA of LNG has been processed and SSGC has received more than 295 BCF of RLNG from the LNG Terminal. 





# Task Force keeps gas thieves on the run



In what was yet another major achievement for SSGC's Customer Relations Department Task Force, 87,380 MCF of illegal gas connections were disconnected following a raid against gas theft at Ilyas Dawood Goth in Korangi, Karachi, on July 12, 2017. The said

connections were causing a loss of nearly Rs. 17 million to the company.

Earlier in the month, raids were carried out in Mirpurkhas and its surrounding regions, in which over 80 illegal connections were terminated and FIRs were lodged against

the culprits. During the month, the Task Force also carried theft detection operations in many other areas of Sindh province, including Tando Allahyar, Tando Haider and Tando Jam. ●

# SSGC all set to commission a complex SNG project



SSGC, with full support from the Government of Pakistan is all set to commission an LPG-Air Mix Plant in Balochistan's Awaran district. The Project, fraught with diverse topographical and law and order issues, is being built at an approximate cost of Rs. 440 million through SSGC's own resources.


Once commissioned, the Awaran LPG-Air Mix (Synthetic Natural Gas or SNG) plant would handle a capacity of 100 mmbtu/hr (2 mmcf/d) SNG and would benefit 800 households of the town. It was in 2013 when during an official visit to Awaran, the then Prime Minister announced the installation of SNG Plant in various locations of Balochistan including Awaran as part of the Government's plan to supply

SNG to those areas that are far off from the distribution grid. The project was pinned as the highest priority LPG-Air Mix scheme.

Despite numerous challenges, SSGC and outsourced contractors have been implementing the project with true grit. Located in one of the most under-privileged areas in Balochistan, the plant site is surrounded by rocky terrains and hard soil. Being the hub of insurgency in the province, Awaran offered a very difficult atmosphere to work due to a deteriorating law and order situation that led security operations to flush out the insurgents. The perilous situation meant that the teams had to finish their respective tasks well before dusk so that they could depart for their homes on time. SSGC also

sought security cover from the Frontier Constabulary (FC Corps) and the local administration.

The supply of SNG to Awaran will help to raise people's living standards by providing affordable fuel to the domestic sector and will also give a new opportunity for commercial sectors to run their businesses with an uninterrupted supply of gas. It will also assist in tackling the issue of deforestation in the area as well as discourage relocation of the locals.

In the past, SSGC has helped set up LPG-Air Mix plants in Gwadar, Noshki and Surab in Balochistan and in Kot Ghulam Mohammad in Mirpurkhas, Sindh.

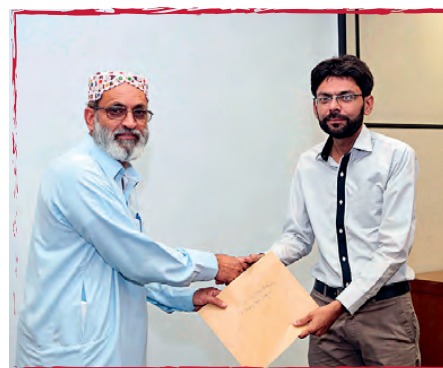

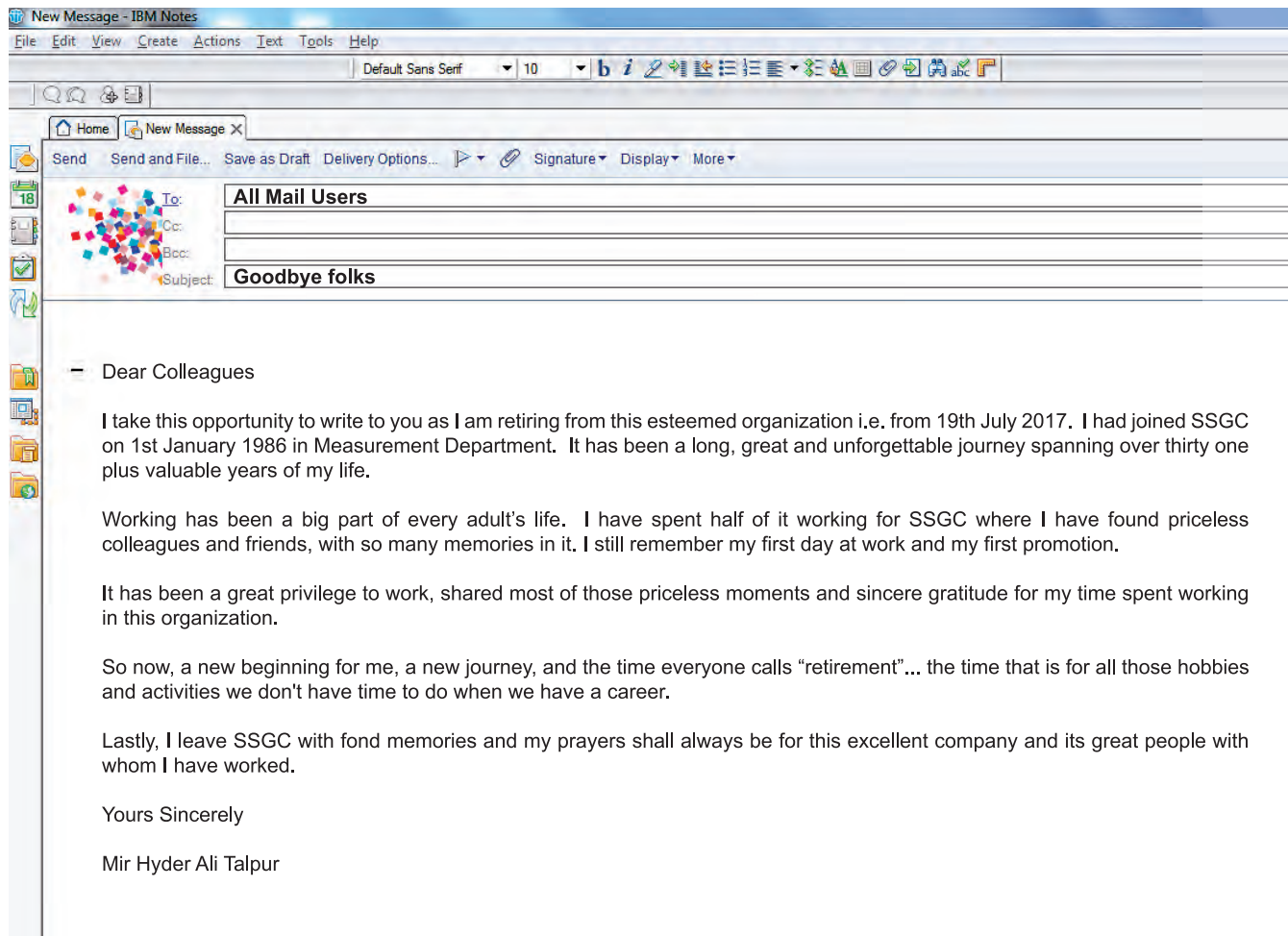

Major Wazir discussed the role that SSGC's emergency vehicles play in various types of

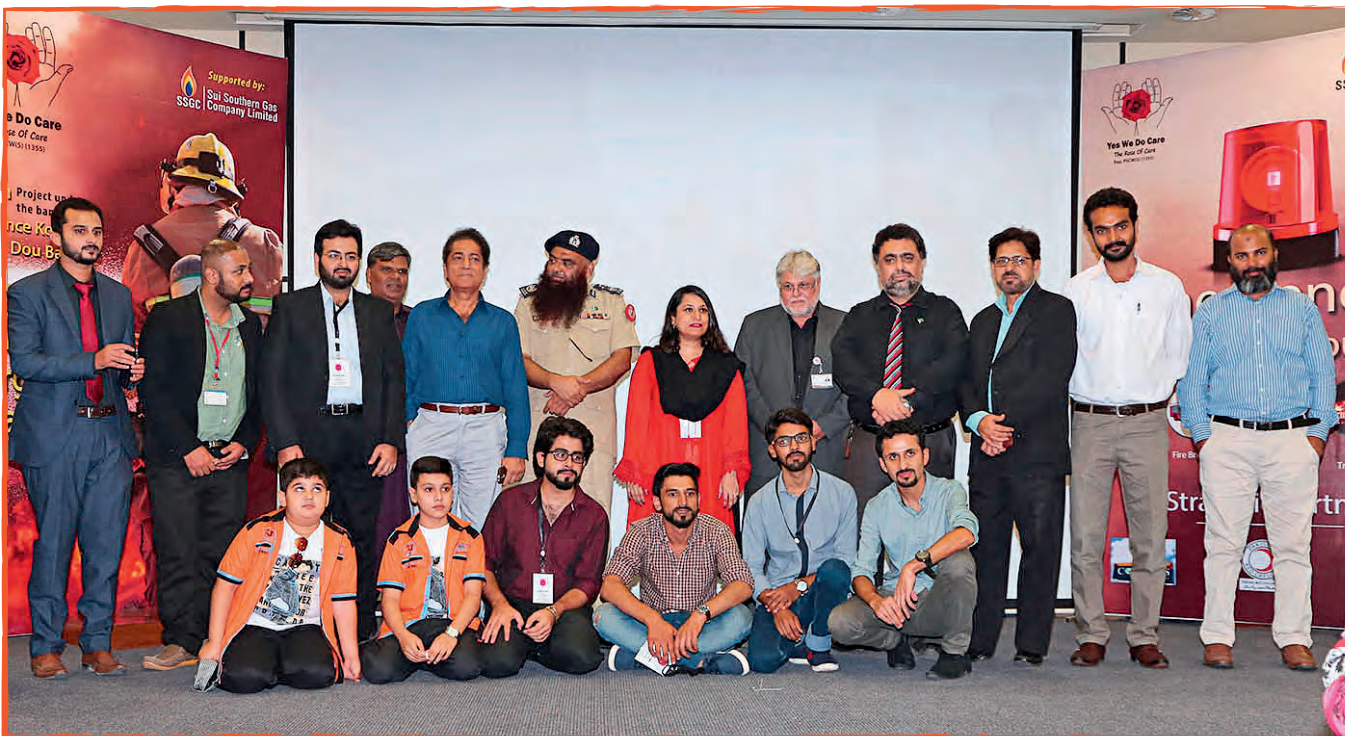


emergency situations including gas-related blasts and leakages in the main line.

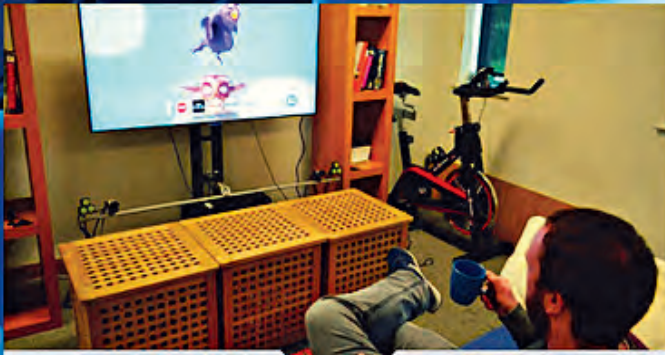

## Activity-recognition Algorithm



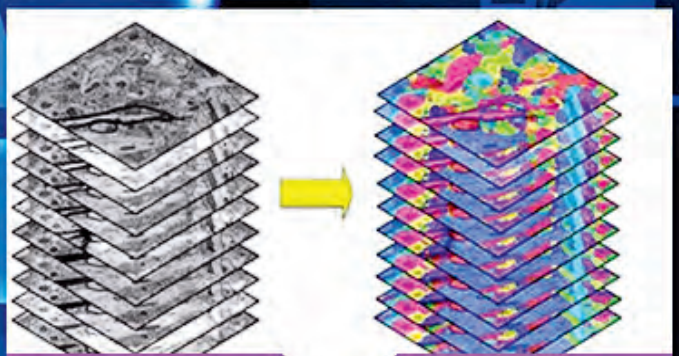
Scientists at the University of Sussex have invented a new algorithm that enables smartwatches to detect and record your every move, without being told beforehand what to look for.

# ENERGY SNAPSHOT

## Gazprom unseats ExxonMobil as world's largest energy company


Russia's Gazprom has topped the S&P Global Platts 250 rating of the world's energy companies. The Company has ousted US oil and gas giant ExxonMobil which reigned for 12 years.

The Russian company is focused on geological exploration, production, transportation, storage, processing and sales of gas, gas condensate and oil, sales of

gas as a vehicle fuel, as well as generation and marketing of heat and electric power. Gazprom has the largest reserves of natural gas in the world and is among Russia's top four oil producers.

ExxonMobil is now ranked only ninth. Among other big improvers, Germany's E.ON climbed 112 places to 2nd place from 114th. India's Reliance Industries went up to

3rd place from last year's 8th. The first five companies also include Korea Electric Power and Chinese CNPC. Russian oil company Lukoil is in sixth place.

The rating is formed on the basis of financial indicators of companies, including the value of assets, total revenues, net profit and others. All companies on the list have assets of more than \$5.5 billion. 





# Bangladesh set to sign 15-year LNG import deal with Qatar



**B**angladesh will sign a 15-year deal with Qatar's RasGas Co to import liquefied natural gas (LNG) starting in 2018 as the South Asian country turns to the supercooled fuel to fill a domestic supply gap for power generation, officials said.

The deal will be signed on September 25 in Qatar, said Mohammad Quamruzzaman, managing director of the Rupantarita Prakritik Gas Co, a unit of state-owned oil firm Petrobangla. Under the deal, RasGas will supply 1.8 million tonnes a year of LNG

for the first five years and 2.5 million tonnes a year for the next 10 after that, the Petrobangla officials said.

The deal is Bangladesh's first LNG import agreement and will help to cover the country's domestic natural gas shortfall. The contract with the world's biggest LNG exporter underscores the rise of South Asia as a new market for the fuel.

Bangladesh, a country of more than 160 million people, could import as much as 17.5 million tonnes of LNG a year by 2025,

Nasrul Hamid, Bangladesh's state minister for energy and power, said. The country's own gas reserves are depleting at the same time it is seeking to almost double its power capacity to 24,000 megawatts by 2021. Bangladesh is planning to tap the currently cheap and plentiful global LNG supplies and invest heavily in importing the fuel. South Asia is emerging as a hotspot for LNG, with Pakistan and Bangladesh set to join India as major consumers and help ease the oversupply that has dogged the market for years. ●

## South Korea is Iran's new natural gas client



**S**tate-run Korea Gas Corp (KOGAS), the world's second-largest single buyer of liquefied natural gas (LNG), says it plans to import natural gas from Iran as well as explore opportunities to acquire gas field stakes in the country.

A KOGAS official said the company was looking to diversify its import sources as supply contracts with Qatar and Oman were set to expire by 2015.

"Iran is rich in natural gas so we would like

to work closely with both public and private energy companies there," the official was quoted as saying.

In May 2016, Iran awarded a deal to carry out technical studies on the offshore Balal gas field in the Persian Gulf to KOGAS.

An Iranian official said in June this year that the country was working on a plan to develop small-size gas liquefaction units with South Korean companies, including KOGAS.

Saeed Pakseresht, director for research and development affairs of the National Iranian Gas Company (NIGC), was quoted saying that a consortium from Iran and another from South Korea, including Oceanus and KOGAS, would be involved in the scheme.

"We do not have the technology to develop mini-LNG plants, but joining hands with companies like the Oceanus consortium and KOGAS is an important first step to develop our LNG sector," he said. ●



# Digital marketing trends to look out for

If there is one advertising/marketing platform that is changing at a very fast pace, then it definitely has to be digital marketing. And yes, it sometimes gets tough to keep abreast of the ever-changing demands and challenges it brings.

Make sure to keep the following points in mind when designing your digital media strategy for 2018.

## 1) Micro moments

We check our phone several times a day for purposes such as emails, online shopping, social media, etc., and in doing so we are bombarded with endless ads, offers, emails, texts, tweets and push notifications. As consumers, we tend to lose interest and reach a point of 'content saturation'. This is exactly where the concept of 'micro-moments' helps marketers. Micro moments are those when consumers use their device to learn, compare or buy a service or product within the shortest time span. In those micro moments, they intend to make their decisions. For micro-moments marketing to work, marketers need to study insights and identify the micro moments of their target audience and then play around with them through contextual marketing, which means providing targeted advertising based upon user information, such as the search terms they are using or recent web-browsing activities. Once you know what your consumer wants, make use of that info. You need to be sure that in these few seconds, the interactive experience you are providing offers value, in terms of offers, discounts,

insights, exclusive experiences or information.

## 2) Video ads

They say a picture is worth a thousand words, but in the digital world a video is worth a thousand pictures! Some FMCGs have started to use highly-engaging video features on different social media platforms, although the majority still hesitate from doing so owing to reasons such as budget constraints, limited exposure, risk factors, and so on. There is a long list of local brands that have been regular and innovative when it comes to TVCs but don't opt for digital videos. Their main argument is that rather than make a special digital video they might as well go for a TVC. Brands need to know that the objectives of a TVC and digital videos are poles apart. Digital videos are to-the-point and require their own creative strategy. The majority of social media users are the young – the instant generation. They do not want to see a two to three minute commercial of a brand on their timeline. However, if the same brand comes up with a short video with interesting content, they will not only like and share it, they will also discuss it. Engaging content plays a crucial role here.

## 3) Choose native ads over non-native ads

The most common concern of all internet users are the highly interruptive and irrelevant ads that pop up while they are reading or buying something on a website. Ad-blocking technologies are becoming extremely

popular. So, how to reach out to the relevant audience? Opt for native ads. Native ads are not ignored like traditional ads, because they don't even appear to be like an ad. Messages like "Buy our products," "Shop now," etc., are NOT native ads. Native ads connect with the target audience. They entertain, engage or inspire consumers. According to a study by Sharethrough and IPG Media, 25% more consumers look at native ad placements than banner ads. They help brands to market their offerings in a non-invasive way that blends in with the environment a user is comfortable with.

## 4) Augmented reality

Gone are the days when augmented reality (AR) was linked with gaming. Globally, this cutting-edge technology that integrates the digital with the real world has made its mark as an important tool in business and digital marketing. Step into any mall public place outside of Pakistan and you will see how big brands are carrying out interesting campaigns powered by AR. Brands use this mode of advertising not only for their commerce, growth and sales, but to promote various causes. For example, Coca-Cola collaborated with WWF to raise funds for the polar bears in the Arctic. The idea was very interesting. They made a set-up in the London Science Museum, where visitors could get close to a virtual family of polar bears through a big screen – and this created an emotional connect.

The guidelines for a heart-healthy diet are simple: keep it high-fibre, antioxidant-rich, low-sodium and low-cholesterol; crank up the potassium; avoid trans fats and limit packaged foods. Enrich your diet with these five foods that love your heart.

and atherosclerosis (plaque build-up)

Polyunsaturated fats or good fats can take the credit for the favourable reputation of these nuts. They help lower cholesterol and reduce inflammation. Bursting with omega-3 fatty acids, fibre, vitamin E and folate, almonds and walnuts reduce the absorption of cholesterol into the blood stream. The plant sterols in these nuts encourage the body to make less 'bad' LDL and more 'good' (high-density lipoproteins). A study by the University of London found that eating a handful of almonds a day could cut the risk of heart disease by 15 per cent and diabetes by 40 per

**What they do:** Healthy cholesterol levels

Use a combination of polyunsaturated fatty acids (PUFAs), like sun-flower oil or safflower oil; and monounsaturated fatty acids (MUFAs), like rice bran oil, sesame oil, groundnut oil, mustard oil and extra-virgin olive oil. MUFAs and PUFAs help maintain healthy cholesterol levels, and reduce the risk of stroke and heart disease.

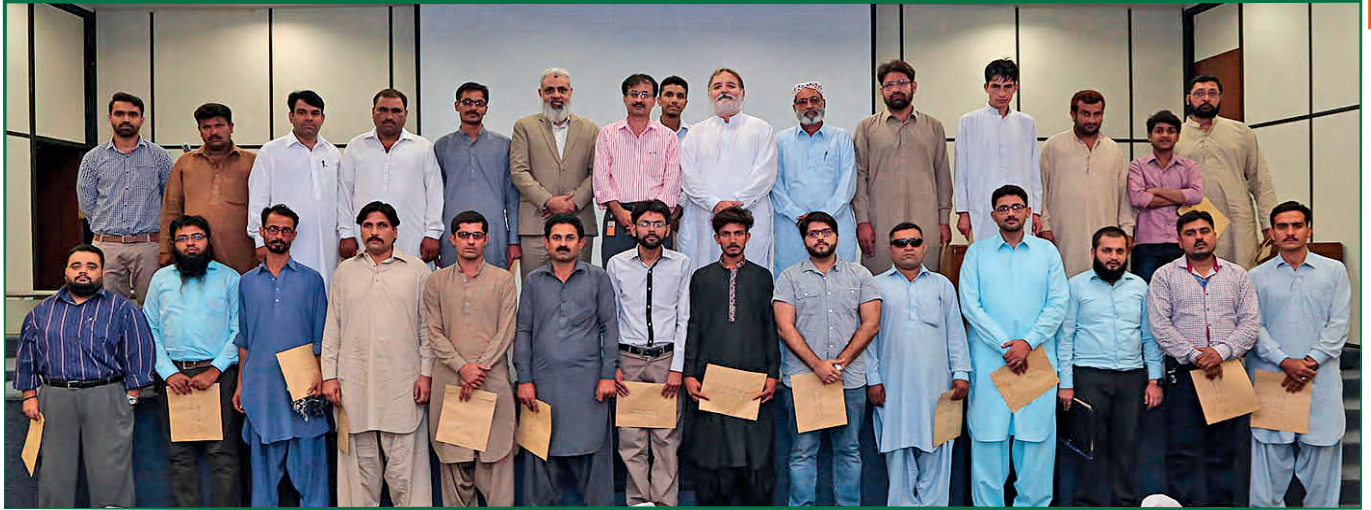
**What they do:** Lowers triglycerides, raises HDL

Omega-3, found in fish, prevents clots and regulates cholesterol and fats in blood. "Omega fats lower triglyceride levels and 'bad' cholesterol. It works on the conversion of LDL and helps the body flush it," says Sharma. Krishnan recommends rohu, surmai (king fish) and hilsa to reduce exposure to fish contaminated with heavy metals and advises, "Consume 100 g of fish twice a week to meet your nutritional needs."

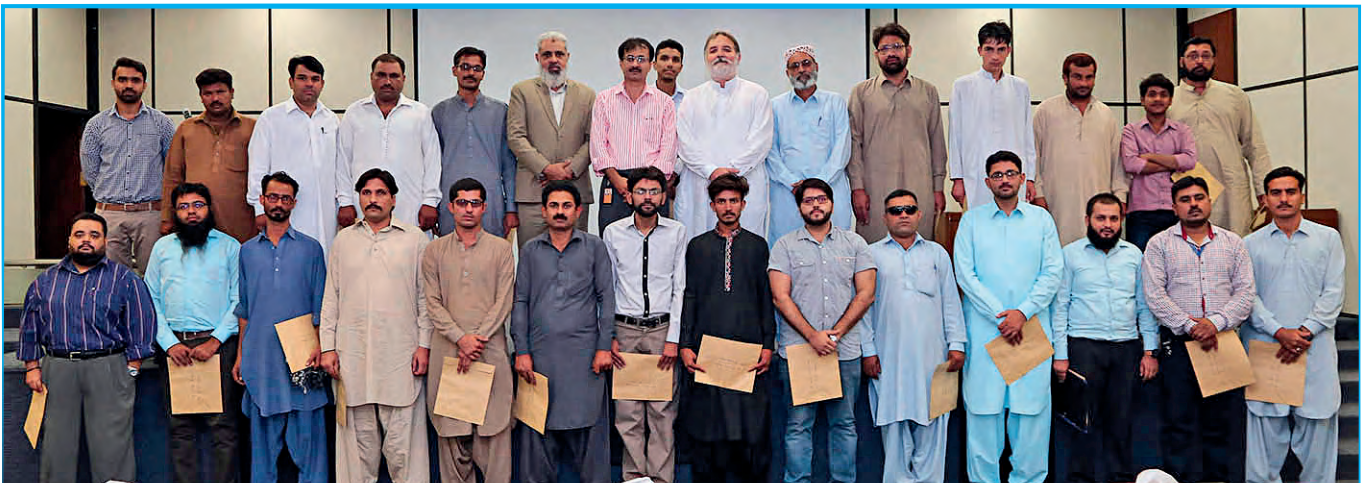
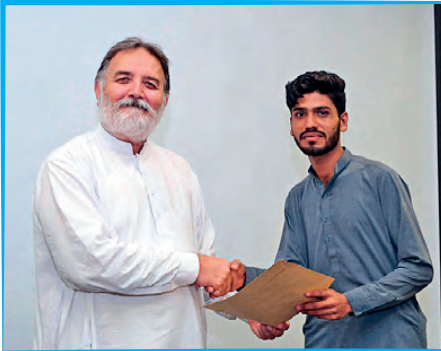
