**SSGC conducts more than 35 raids on
illegal connections; one accused nabbed**





SSGC's Counter Gas Theft Operations (CGTO) team has intensified its drive against miscreants involved in blatant use of gas theft in its franchise areas of Sindh and Balochistan.

As part of the Operation Grift, the team conducted around 35 raids in the later part of June and made numerous disconnections. A raid was conducted in a hotel located in Karachi's F.B. Area where the offenders were found using gas directly through rubber pipe. The load found at the site was approximately 75 cubic feet per hour. The hotel owner was apprehended as per the Gas (Theft and

Recovery) Act 2016. FIR was lodged and subsequently claim was generated against the miscreant.

In Hyderabad, the team cracked down on a business unit named Fareed Ahmed Medico Company where gas was being used illegally for power generation purposes. The team removed the tampered meter and regulator and dismantled the service line. The load found at the site was 230 cubic feet per hour. The claim was raised accordingly.

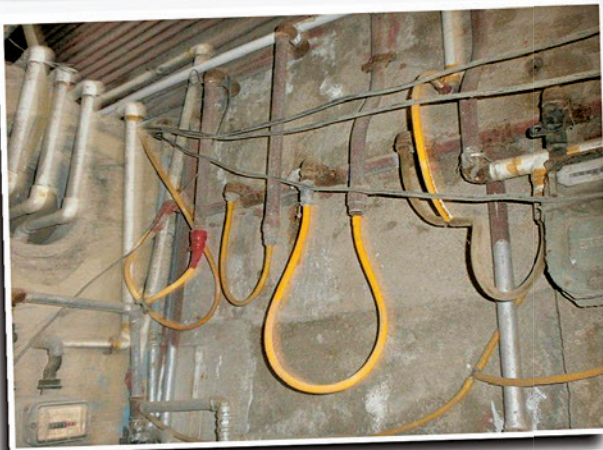
The CGTO also conducted raids in Saeedabad (Baldia Town), Saddar and Lines Area in

Karachi and in Samungali Road in Quetta. Illegal gas connections were dismantled and claims were subsequently raised.

SSGC has expressed its determination to uproot the menace of gas theft, one of the key factors behind Unaccounted-for-Gas (UFG). The Gas Theft Control and Recovery Act passed by the National Assembly in 2016 and the recent establishment of Gas Utility Courts have given the gas distribution companies the mandate to take an unprecedented legal action against the miscreants. **◻**

No retreat, no surrender

CGTO Department remains determined to control the menace of gas theft

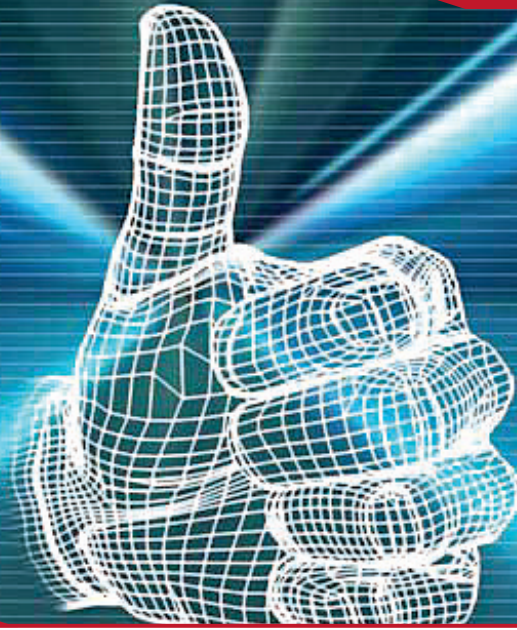
In July 2017, a major milestone was achieved when Security Services and Counter Gas Theft Operations (SS & CGTO) Department was formed for the primary objective of controlling the rising menace of natural gas theft, one of the primary factors behind Unaccounted for Gas or UFG. The formation of the Department was seen as the major shot in the arm in SSGC's drive against natural gas theft that constitutes about 51% of UFG. Spurred on by Gas Theft and Recovery Act 2016 and the formation of Gas Utility Courts in Balochistan and Sindh, the Department was restructured into several wings as part of a larger objective to rein in gas thieves. The first intelligence based operation against gas thieves was conducted in August 12, 2017 on a Poultry Farm located in Gadap Town, Karachi when gas was being stolen directly from Main Pipeline through 2' pipe in order to use it for power generation through a 60 KVA Generator. Since been there has been no turning back for the Department that has gone from strength to strength, cracking down on domestic, commercial and industrial units. The Department is accompanied in every raid by SSGC Police that lodges FIR against the culprits and works in tandem with the Prosecution Wing to bring them to book.

To date the Department has carried out 816 raids on domestic, commercial and industrial units. These raids have helped save gas volume to the tune of around 938 MMCFD. Consequently claims have been raised to the tune of Rs. 718 million.

One of the biggest achievements of the Department is that thanks to excellent prosecution, some miscreants involved in gas theft have been sentenced to prison term and fined. Only recently three offenders from Karachi were served with 5 year prison term and were fined Rs. 50000 for their misdemeanors. This is a major victory against gas theft, one that will act as a deterrence for the miscreants who prefer to steal gas rather than obtain legal connections. ●

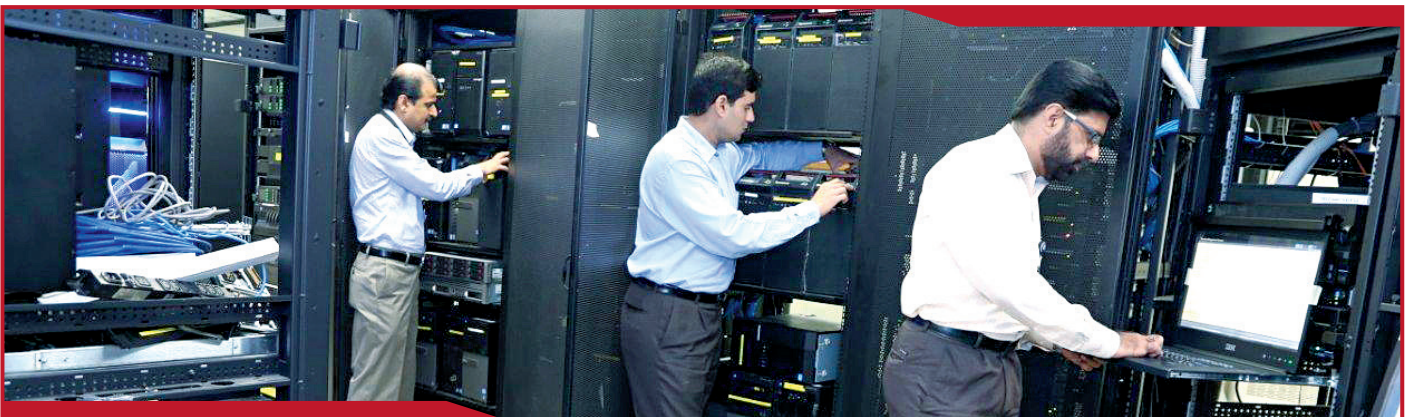

Averting crisis through effective communication



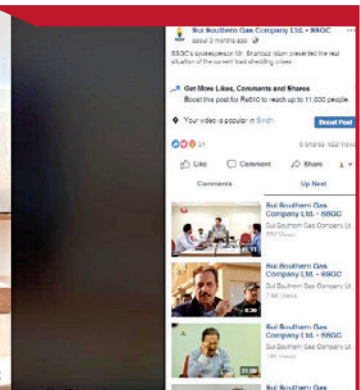

- SSGC has a long list of **satisfied customers** who honour their agreements. KE needs a **lot of catching up to do** on this front.

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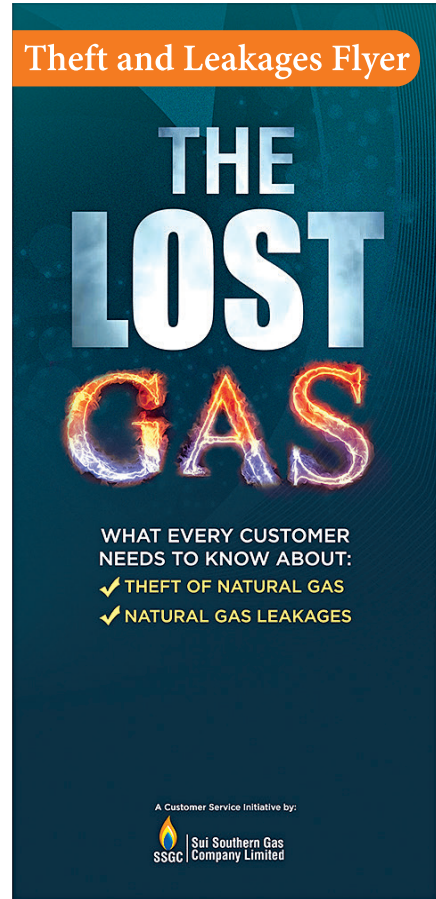
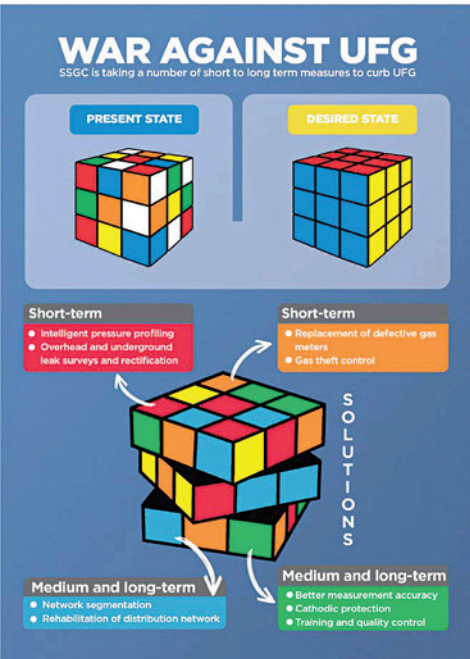
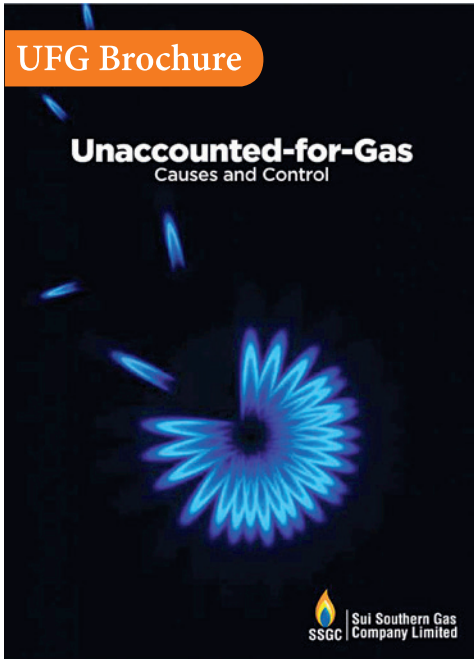

SSGC Averting Crisis... ..Not Creating One

- SSGC is taking **proactive steps** to provide relief to the citizens of Karachi, whose lives have been made miserable by prolonged load shedding.
- In April 2017, SSGC informed KE that if no new reservoirs are added to the system, supply situation will get worse. It seems KE **did not pay heed** to our call.
- To this day, KE is disputing overdues amount it owes to SSGC. We took the lead in developing **in quick time**, ToR (with KE's consent) for appointing one of the top Chartered Accountancy firms to analyze SSGC's financial statements so that dues amount payable to the gas utility can be determined.
- It has been more than **10 days** since SSGC shared ToR with KE. SSGC is **still awaiting positive reply.**
- All SSGC is expecting of KE is to show a **clear intent** of signing a GSA, after which it will talk to less priority sectors for diverting gas to meet KE's 'shortfall'.
- NEPRA's findings have justified SSGC's **bona fide position** of 'low gas supply from fields' that KE has used as a pretext for additional load shed.

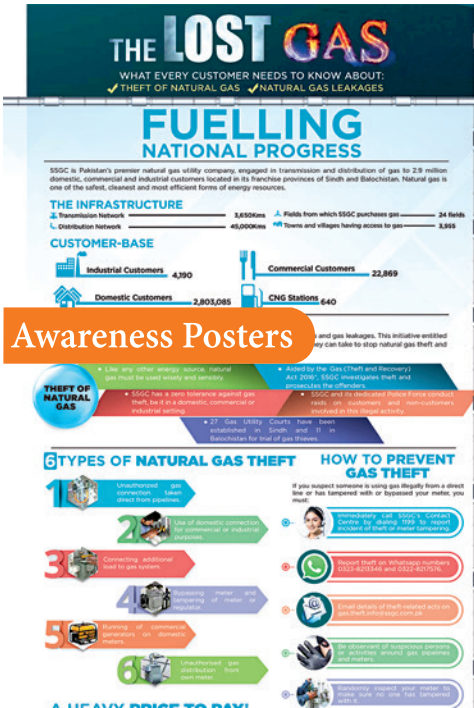

Dealing with bad leaders



Bad leadership often spreads fast like an epidemic and in some cases the damage caused can be permanent. Bad leaders affect every area, particularly the business culture they administer, which very quickly becomes toxic.

Here are some signs that you might become contaminated because of bad leadership and, as a result, the creation of a toxic culture:

1-Communication issues, such as no communication at all, indirect communication i.e. sending messages through others, withholding information, giving misleading information, and other dysfunctional patterns such as negative communication with employees, always complaining about management, and blaming others.

2-Inconsistency in following policies and procedures.

3-Low morale, low engagement and high turnover. Those with high self-esteem and self-worth feel forced to speak up, rather than put up with nonsense.

4-Lack of productivity and unpredictable business performance.

5-Erosion of integrity.

Even though you could never live up to your potential as a leader in this type of environment, you may find yourself in poor leadership situations and not be in a position to leave immediately. Knowing this, here are some ways to survive, albeit temporarily:

Seek out like-minded colleagues. If you look hard, you will find someone feeling just like you. You can buddy up and be each other's positivity support system. Set some ground rules that you will both only look at the positive side of things and find solutions rather than complaining, and you will reduce the feeling of being alone in a negative environment.

Control your space. If you are not in a co-working environment, try to make your working space as happy and as bright as possible with things you love - paintings, pictures of your family, posters with inspiring quotes, etc. This is priming at its best. Also, if you can play some music quietly that takes you to a happy place, without distracting your concentration, by all means play it. These things will help keep you in balance to face bad leadership and a toxic environment.

Treat the experience like a case study. Stand outside yourself, take nothing personally, and be an observer - know you are being tested and there are some valuable lessons to be learned from the bad examples.

Stay above the fray. Keep your emotions at bay and be aware who presses your buttons, and when. Try to distance yourself as much as possible from people and situations that add to your discomfort.

Plan your exit. You can't change corporate leadership and culture on your own. You are fighting against a person that has become this way over time, and you have to really look within and decide whether it is worth your time and effort.

Bad leadership is like a cloud of darkness covering the light of everything and everyone within it. Good leadership is seeking light that permeates everything and everyone it encounters. Always choose light when you can. ◉

- Mother of Maqbool Ahmed Shaikh, DCM (SS&CGTO) -Karachi expired on May 13, 2018.

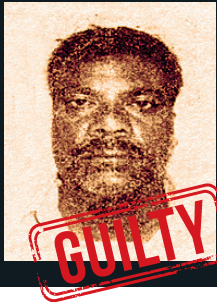

Gas thieves sentenced under Gas Theft Act 2016



- Gas Utility Court has served 5-years prison term and fine of Rs. 50,000/- to 3 culprits involved in gas theft related offences. Mohammad Shafique, a Pakwan Center owner was arrested from Pak Colony, Karachi while two other accused Dildar and Yasir were nabbed from New Karachi, following raids conducted by SSGC's Security Services and Counter Gas Theft Operations (SS & CGTO) and Police teams.
- Shafique is the first accused to be convicted in SSGC's franchise areas under The Gas (Theft and Recovery) Act 2016*
- Their cases were argued before Gas Utility Court after they were filed by the SSGC Police.
- Efficient prosecution will be pursued against gas thieves in future as well.

LNG at heart of energy plans: US Energy Secretary

US Energy Secretary Rick Perry has said that rapid growth in the country's natural gas industry underlines why the Trump administration continues to see fossil fuels as a crucial part of the long-term US energy mix.

Perry said the shale boom that's led the US towards the cusp of energy independence over the past decade has been an "energy miracle". Thirty years ago people would be "dumbfounded" if told the country would be on a path to becoming the world's largest oil and gas producer in 2018, he said, crediting innovation and taking aim at critics of the

Trump administration's "all-of-the-above" energy strategy.

"In some quarters there is stubborn opposition to natural gas and other fuels - even as fossil fuels become cleaner. The latest estimates show that by 2040 fossil fuels will comprise 75% of energy usage - the answer is not to exclude, but include."

Perry pointed to progress in the liquefied natural gas sector as an example of how innovation can foster environmental progress. Last year, the US became a net gas exporter for the first time in 60 years, has just

set a record of 81.2 billion cubic feet per day of natural gas production, and is now exporting to 30 countries, he pointed out.

Further, a number of US-based LNG projects are expected to come on stream over the next two years, creating 68 million tonnes per year of new export capacity. Other speakers said the country's evolution into a leading LNG exporter could have wider geopolitical, economic, and environmental implications. ●

RLNG enables Pakistan to save \$2-3 billion on power generation



With the import of LNG, Pakistan has so far benefited by \$2-3 billion through replacing furnace oil and diesel with imported liquefied gas as fuel for power generation.

At present LNG of 1-1.2 billion cubic feet per day is being injected into Pakistan's economy which is playing a pivotal role in catering to the various sectors of the economy.

Top sources in the Ministry of Energy (Petroleum Division) said that Pakistan LNG Limited (PLL) has been able to put the country on the world LNG map and has developed PLL into a world class company literally from scratch. PLL has even managed to obtain LNG prices cheaper by 18-20 % than the cargoes being imported by Pakistan State Oil and rates 25-30 % cheaper than the other countries which are currently importing LNG.

According to sources, PLL has been able to achieve the lowest LNG prices the world over and if this process continues at these or better prices the additional savings will be \$300-400 million annually or \$3.5-4 billion over the next decade. This is in addition to the annual savings of \$2-3 billion annually by displacing oil imports and will further bring down average LNG prices in Pakistan.

Pakistan has so far attracted over \$6 billion in developing LNG infrastructure and the same amount will also be invested in laying down 1 more RLNG specific pipeline, one more RLNG power plant at Trimmu and four more LNG terminals. So in all, from establishing LNG terminals to pipeline and powerhouses a massive investment of \$8-10 billion will be made in the country through this initiative.

Pakistan is currently producing 20 GWs plus electricity on average, and out of which, 7-8

GW electricity can be generated by LNG, and power outages have been reduced from an average of 8-12 hours per day to less than two hours.

Qatar Petroleum pumps US\$20b into US oil, gas

Qatar Petroleum, the world's biggest seller of liquefied natural gas (LNG), is looking to get even larger, investing US\$20 billion in America's oil and gas fields at a time when rival US exporters are expanding.

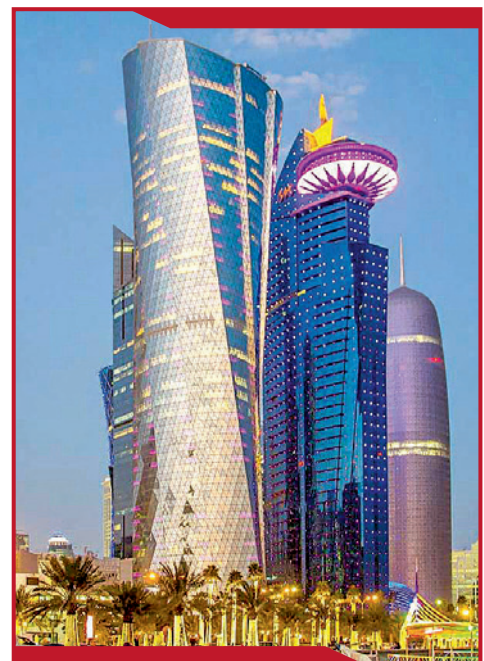
The investments will be made over five years, chief executive officer Saad Sherida al-Kaabi said in an interview in Washington. Some of that will likely go towards lining up gas supplies for the Golden Pass LNG export project in Texas, being developed with ExxonMobil.

Mr. al-Kaabi said Qatar will probably be announcing a deal in the US "before the end of the year", but he declined to say whether it would involve oil or gas. Qatar is also looking to invest an additional US\$5 billion in so-called downstream assets, such as chemicals projects, he said.

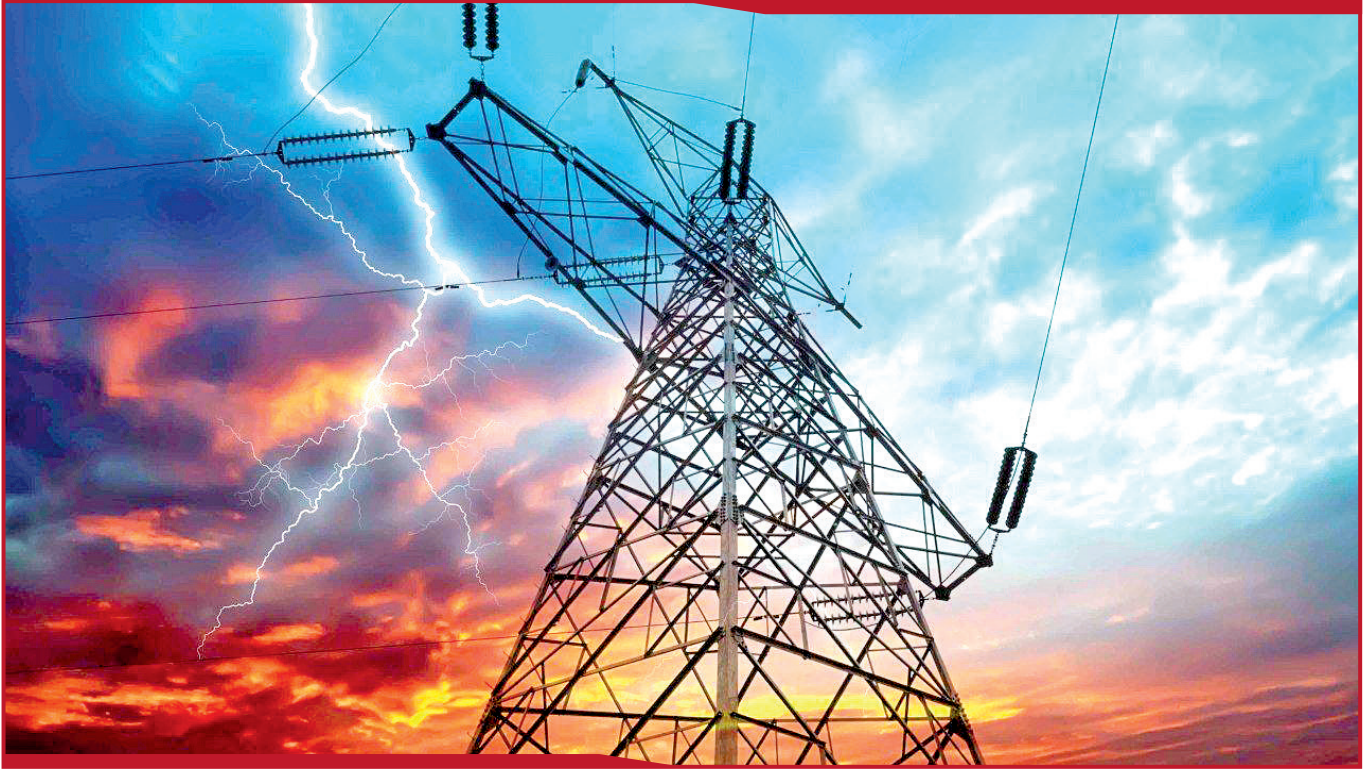
"We have a huge growth plan," Mr. al-Kaabi said. "We're talking to many people and many companies in the US." Within eight years, he added, the company plans to go "from 4.8 million barrels of oil equivalent a day to 6.5 million".

The state-owned company is looking at both shale and conventional resources in the US, according to Mr al-Kaabi. Qatar Petroleum and its partners in the Golden Pass project are now weighing commercial bids from contractors, and expect to decide whether to move forward with the project by the first quarter of 2019, he said. ●

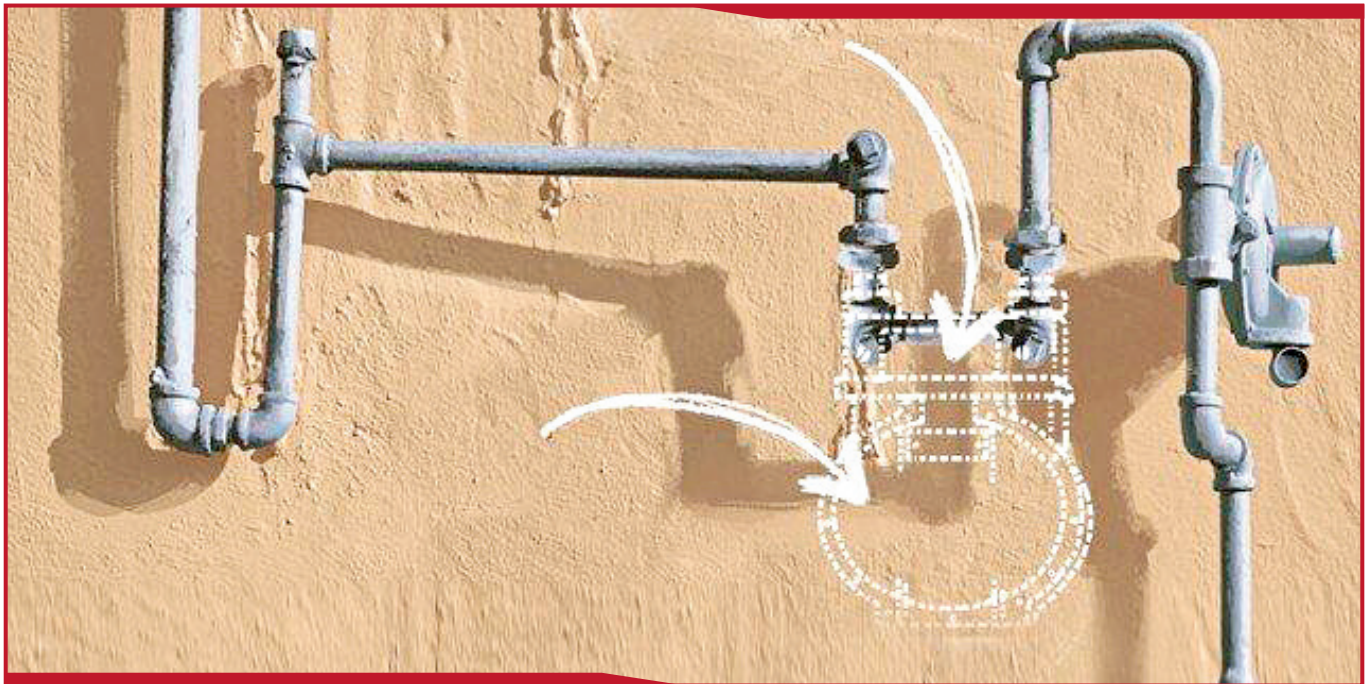
